

#### MIXED TURKISH & IRANIAN FRANKING KERMANSHAH 1914: exchange of emails between Mr

Khosrow Joe Youseffi and Mr Iraj Eftekhar

#### From Mr Youseffi

Attached is a scan of an on-piece with mixed franking of Ottoman stamp and Ahmad Shah 1914 overprint, also with Kirmanshah cancel. The date is 10 - IX - ??. If this item is genuine, it would imply a date of September 1914.



Reply from Mr Eftekhar

The mixed franking of Ahmad Shah with Turkish stamp is genuine and extremely rare, the date is September 10, 1916 (The Turkish 10 Paras here was overprinted in 1915) when the Turkish army had firm control of State of Kurdistan + Kermanshah. The only full cover of mixed franking Turkish with Ahmad Shah stamp which I have seen before was auctioned two years ago in Turkey by Isaphila (if I remember the name right.) When I noticed it on internet, the auction was

over!! I was very disappointed; I believe Tony Zonneveld has the image of that cover saved in his file.

#### EARLIEST USAGE OF 1938 AIR POSTCARD: by Mr Mehrdad Sadri (From the Discussion Group)

Recently a **50d air-postcard** was offered on eBay by Mr. Esmaili and I asked him to send me its scans which I am very grateful for his kindness.

The type-written date of the postcard is **16 August 1938** and the postcard was mailed on 17 August 1938 with the **TEHERAN (DEPART) 17 VIII 38** postmark. On the message side of the postcard, there is a **BAGHDAD 18 AUG 38** transit postmark as well as Prague (**PRAHA 23 VIII 38**) receiving postmark.

As I have mentioned to Mr. Esmaili, it seems that this is the **Earliest Known Usage** of this Air-Postcard, however it would be very interesting if other members would kindly check their own collections to see if they have any earlier date of usage, so then we might be able to establish a date of issue for this very rare postcard.

#### 50c ENGRAVED NASSERI ISSUE: by Mr\_Amir Hussein Bonackdar \_From the Discussion Group

I have attached a 50c Engraved Naseri which has been printed both sides. One side is black and the other side is black and orange.

Have any of members seen this error yet?



Response from Mr David Creson

I assume your copy is imperforated. I have a vertical pair, black, one side only (Imperforated). I believe they are 1885 Paris forgery "Proofs". Reference Persi catalogue pp 51-2. In my option they are not common and very collectable.

Respnse from Mr Iraj Eftekhar

The imperforated 50C. Engraved Nasseri on both sides is a proof, also All Nasseri Issues except 1881 Litho, & Recess exist imperforated.

It is common practice that the Nasseri's proofs and imperforated stamps were mistakenly identified for each other by most collectors .

The similar proof for the estimated price of 350 Swiss Frank was auctioned and sold for 270 SF. by Christie's Robson Lowe Auction of Novemeber 12, 1987 in Zurich Switzerland. For the further reference, Images from Robson Lowe auction catalogue are attached.







### AN INTERESTING COVER by Bernard Lucas.

The cover illustrated is a recent acquisition and it gave me some questions to answer before writing it up.

It is a 1 Kran postal stationery envelope with a 1906 type-set 10 chahis on the front and 2 x 2chahis of 1903 on the back, all cancelled SULTANABAD-ARAK 20-7-07. There are also a 1 chahi 1903 and a 2 chahis 1906 type-set on the back, cancelled TEHERAN 23/7 (arrival) and there is a TEHERAN I 23-7-07 shield cancel, which is presumably the departure mark. The cover is addressed to Tauris but there is no arrival mark.

Sassan Pehjan has very kindly translated the Persian to the left of the 1 Kran stamp as "registered, Tabriz Alijah Ziegler Company".

The postage would therefore appear to be for a 6 to 7 miskals registered letter, made up as follows :-

Letter	6 chahis + 5 x 3 chahis	=	1 kran	1 chahi.
Registr	ation			16 chahis.

However, if one looks carefully at the cover, the lower right corner of the 2 chahis 1906 type-set is actually over the SULTANABAD-ARAK cancel on the back. I therefore wondered how this had happened and why the 2 chahis and 1 chahi stamps had been cancelled in Tehran. My explanation is that the cover was prepared by Ziegler & Co. and stamps added to make the 1 kran 14 chahis rate for a 5 to 6 miskals registered letter and then sealed with sealing wax. It was then taken to the post office, where the counter clerk, seeing that it was already stamped, cancelled the stamps and then probably weighed it before entering it in the registration register. He then found it weighed over 6 miskals, probably due to the sealing wax being added and a further 3 chahis in stamps had to be added, but he forgot to cancel them. When the cover arrived in Tehran this was noticed and the stamps were cancelled with the Tehran arrival mark. I do not know whether this is correct and if any member has a better explanation, I should be pleased to hear it.

A LARGE REGISTERED AIR RATE by Bernard Lucas.

When I was preparing my updated list of rates last year, I discounted the illustrated piece, because one cannot be sure that all the philatelic information is there. Earlier this year, I came across it again and was contemplating soaking off the stamps, as I do not usually like stamps on piece, when I noticed the manuscript numbers and realised that using these proved this rate.

A large piece of most of the front of a registered air letter sent from the Iranian Oil Refining Company in Abadan to Iranian Oil Services Ltd in London.

This is a good example of proving the rates, as the weight and postage are shown in manuscript on the front.

It is shown as packet No.44 and bears the ABADAN registration cachet, number 4021, which is also shown in manuscript to the left of it.

The weight and rate are shown in Western figures and were probably put on by the IORC clerk. They are as follows :-

1950 = 1,950 grams.

1857 is the total of the surface foreign letter rate plus the air premium, as follows : Surface rate is 6 rials for the first 20 grams plus 3 rials for each subsequent 20 grams.
1,960 is 98 bands of 20 grams and the surface rate is 98 x 3 + 3 = 297 rials. The air premium was 8 rials per 10 grams = 195 x 8 = 1,560.

297 + 1,560 = 1,857 rials.

8.50 is the registration fee of 8 rials plus the compulsory charity tax of 50 dinars. Giving a total of 1,865 rials 50 dinars.

The postage stamps used are of the 1964-65 definitive issue, perf.10.5, as follows :

50 rials was the highest definitive value at the time.



**Minutes** of the meeting held on Saturday 4 June 2011 at 2pm at Congress House, 23/28 Great Russell Street, London WC1B 3LS.

Mr N R N Gooch was in the chair and Messrs R Jack, B Lucas, J A Scannell and D Tanner were in attendance.

Apologies were received from Messrs P A Greenway and R Samuels.

As a novelty Bernard Lucas passed round a large piece from a 1,950 gram letter postmarked 25 February 1965 which fitted perfectly with the table of rates which he had published earlier. He indicated that he would prepare a small article for the journal.

The minutes of the meeting held on 9 April 2011 had been previously published in the journal. They were taken as read and approved by the meeting. There were no matters arising.

The chairman passed round copies of an email from Bjorn Sohrne who was seeking financial support for a booklet to be published for distribution to members and guests at his forthcoming display of Persia to The Royal Philatelic Society London. After a robust discussion it was agreed that the invitation to display was personal to Bjorn, not to the study circle as a whole, and as such any costs should be paid for either by the exhibitor or the host society.

The chairman then made special welcome to Bernard Lucas, after his absence through illness from the last few meetings, and asked him to lead the display of the 1929 definitive stamps of Shah Reza Pahlavi. Bernard passed round stamps illustrating examples of the various perforations and sizes of centre within the issue followed by examples of both internal and overseas mail carried by surface and air. From their collections Nigel Gooch, Robert Jack, Jim Scannell and Dave Tanner presented further stamps and covers, including those franked for the Nairn Service showing the additional premium payable, and items of insured mail.

The chairman closed the meeting at about 4-15pm and thanked the members for their attendance. He indicated that the next meeting would be held on 8 October 2011 to consider the stamps issued between 1966 and 1969 as definitives for Shah Mohammed Reza Pahlavi.
